

## What you need to know when attending a World Cup match

Dear Fans,

The following information is a service provided by Deutsche Bahn AG's 2006 World Cup Project Team based on the general conditions published by the Organizing Committee of the 2006 FIFA World Cup. It is designed to help you on your way to the stadium and also explains how to look after your World Cup ticket.

### **Journey to the stadium**

Holders of valid 2006 FIFA World Cup™ match tickets may travel free of charge on Deutsche Bahn's local trains, and also use the bus and tram services provided by the regional transport association at the World Cup venue on the day of the match ("Kombiticket").

You can expect to find large numbers of people traveling on all match days. We therefore recommend that you schedule plenty of time for your journey.

### **Deutsche Bahn's special offers**

In addition to the Kombiticket, Deutsche Bahn AG has three special World Cup offers available: the Weltmeister Ticket, the Weltmeister Pass and the Weltmeister BahnCard. ### **Taking care of your World Cup ticket**

Please keep your ticket dry. Do not bend or fold, and do not expose the ticket to high temperatures.

### **Ticket transfers**

World Cup tickets are not transferable. They may only be used by the person whose personal data were registered for the ticket. Transferring or selling the ticket to a third party is not allowed under any circumstances.

The 2006 FIFA World Cup™ match tickets issued by DB AG are not permitted on the 2006 FIFA Organizing Committee's official ticket exchange.

If you are unable to use your World Cup ticket, please contact DB's organizing team (hotline: +49 (0)30 - 297 62009). It may be possible for them to pass on the ticket to someone else.

### **Baggage**

Large bags, backpacks and suitcases are not permitted in the stadium. The Stadium Regulations for the 2006 FIFA World Cup™ provides details of other prohibited items. ### Security checks

An outer and an inner security cordon will be set up at each stadium for all 2006 FIFA World Cup™ matches.

A visual check of the tickets will take place at the outer security cordon, plus a search of the person's clothing and other belongings.

The actual entry check takes place at the inner security cordon by means of turnstile entrances that are electronically controlled. The turnstiles are released by the chip integrated into the ticket to provide entry to the stadium.

Additional security checks of individuals will be carried out if deemed necessary and depending on the prevailing circumstances.

### ID documents

Please take along the proof of identity you used to personalize your ticket. If you are unable to present the registered document for inspection, you can expect to encounter delays. If you are unable to identify yourself, you will be refused admission to the stadium.

FIFA's "Ticket General Terms & Conditions" apply, including the exceptions indicated here and the Stadium Regulations for the 2006 FIFA World Cup™.
